general course S.53°W.from its intersection with line 4-1,708 ft.from Cor.No.4. Said fence belongs to R.F. Byers.

Two plots of cultivated ground,heretofore mentioned containing approximately 0.2 acres and 0.1 acres respectively. Said cultivated plot belongs to R.F.Byers.

A 4 inch.pipe line for water--the head of which is at the mouth of the tunnel described under improvements No.2--draining Southeasterly;about 750 ft.of which is on this claim,belongs to claimant herein.

INSTRUMENT.

This survey was made with a Gurley Light Mountain transit. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by observation on Polaris. The distances were measured with 100 ft.and 200 ft.steel tapes.

NOTE.

The disagreement between these field notes and the Additional^{and} Amended Location Certificate in regard to the description of the Lode Line is due to errors in the latter.

REPORT.

The S.E.Cor.of Sec.35 T.21 N.R.40 E. Mt.Diablo Meridian is a Cedar Post 5 ins.diam.,3-1/2 ft.long, marked "T.XXI N.R. XL E.," "S.XXXV. S.XXXVI" and "S. C."on three respective sides. A Mahogany Tree,blazed and scribed same as Sec.Cor.Stake,bears N.20°W.53 ft. The Sec.Cor.Stake which I found fallen by a small mound of rock,I re-established in a mound of rock 5 ft.diam. 2-1/2 ft.high.

After diligent search I was unable to find any Corner of the Public Land Surveys nearer than the Cor. to Secs.35 and 36 T21 N.R. 40. E.
