INSTRUMENT.

This Survey was made with a A. Lietz Transit, No. 1498.

The courses were deflected from the true meridian as  
determined by direct solar observations. The distances  
were measured with 100 ft. and 300 ft. steel tapes.

REPORT.

The lode line of each location of this claim was run  
directly upon the ground, and the several corners  
established by means of offsets from the lode lines. All  
tie lines were run directly upon the ground.
