GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land in this township is very rough and mountainous in all portions except along and near the shore of Pyramid Lake.

Tohakum Peak, the highest peak in the Lake Range, is located in about the middle of sec. 36.

The soil in the mountainous parts is rocky and the land is suitable for grazing purposes only. The soil in the NW. portion and along the shore of Pyramid Lake is sandy and some of the land can be used for agricultural purposes. Water for irrigation can be obtained from numerous large springs that flow toward Pyramid Lake.

The mountain slopes are covered with sage brush and bunch grass, while on the highest ridges and around Tohakum Peak are a few juniper trees. Pyramid Lake (a salt body of water) forms the western boundary of the township.
