Rolling, gravelly slope - ascends towards Mts.
on the N. - Cedars + bunch grass -Feb. 23rd 1873 -

The surface of the ground is rolling in this
township, and ascends towards the Mts. on the
N. to the base of which the lines are extended -
The soil is generally gravelly, with some rich
loam - It is covered for the most part with sage,
bunch grass + some white sage - cedar timber is
also abundant + some pine on the ridges near the
Mts. The ridges are rocky of trachyte formation.
Pony Springs - which are pure fresh water, and where
a sta. is kept on the stage road between Hamilton +
Pioche lie in the S. W. 1/4 of Sec. 14.
