30.00 Cross Gulch, 4 lks. wide, Course $S. \ E.$ and ascend.

40.00 Set a line stone $21 \times 8 \times 6$ ins., 15 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. Cor., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on $N.$ face, and raised a mound of stone. Pits impracticable.
