

Subdivision T. 7 N. R. 27 E.

Chains. July 8, 1901. I go to the cor. to sec. 13-14-23 and 24. which is a stone as described by the Surveyor General. The bearing given for the S. bdy. of S. 24. is $S. 89^{\circ} 50' N.$

Thence I run $N. 89^{\circ} 50' E.$ on a random bet. sec. 13 and 24.

40.00 Set a temp. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.

80.12 Intersect the E. bdy. of T. 7p. 20 lks. S. of the cor. to sec. 13-18-19 and 24.

Thence I run $S. 89^{\circ} 59' N.$ on true line bet. sec. 13 and 24.

20.40 Wagon road, bears $N. N.$ and $S. E.$

34.00 Ascend E. slope.

40.06 Set a volcanic stone $16 \times 8 \times 8$ ins. 11 ins. in the ground for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on N. face; raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high. N. of cor.
