Resurvey of C. Bay, T. 18 N., R. 23 E.
Chains on the previous evening.
At 8 o'clock A.M. July 13, I
set off $39^{\circ}28'N.$ on Lat. arc. 2°
 $58'N.$ on decl. arc. and
determine a true
meridian by Solar
observation.

The line thus determined
coinciding with my
Solar of the previous
evening and with the
true meridian established
by Polaris observation
I conclude the instrument
to be in satisfactory
adjustment. The magnetic
variation is $18^{\circ}16'E.$

At the cor. of Tps. 17 and 18 N.
Rgs. 23 and 24 E. which is a
stone set in mound of
stone and marked as
described by notes of the
Surveyor General.

I rebuild cor. and raise a
mound of stone 3 ft. base,
2 ft. high S. of cor.
