Chains Aug. 15, 1912: - At 7 h. 30 m. a. m.,
l. m. t. I set off $40^{\circ} 19.5' N$ on the
lat. arc; $14^{\circ} 4' N$ on the decl. arc
and determine a meridian
with the solar at the cor. of secs.
1, 2, 35 and 36, Tps. 28 and 29 N,
R. 30 E.

Thence I run

$N 0^{\circ} 1' W$. bet. secs. 35 and 36.

Over mountainous land ascending.

1.40 Wagon road, Lovelock to Poker
Brown Springs, bears $N 30^{\circ} W$. and
 $S. 30^{\circ} E$.

11.40 Top of slope; descend
