General Description.

Nearly all of the land in the eastern half of this township is rough and rolling mountainous, except tracts in the northeast, southeast and central portions which are rolling. The southern extremity of Grass Mountain lies in section four, and is also rough; but the remainder of the township may be classed as rolling.

The main ridge has a northerly and southerly bearing through the two eastern ranges of sections and forms the back bone of the Ely Range, with many prominent peaks having altitudes approximately seven thousand five hundred feet above sea level. This ridge is also the divide between Duck Valley and Mule Shoe Valley, and has many canyons and deep ravines putting to the east and west, thus giving the exposure and drainage of the township generally to the east and west, except the northeast and north central parts which drain and slope to the south. The base of the range or the western border of Duck Valley is about one mile east of the east boundary of the township, while the two western ranges of sections lie almost entirely in Mule Shoe
