	Soil, very shallow rocky clay loam, rock subsoil, 4th rate. Many large surface stones and outcrops.
	Undergrowth, sagebrush, buck brush, some willow.
	Timber, pinon pine, juniper, mahogany.
	Excellent grazing.

	East, on true line, along the S. bdy. of sec. 36,
	Over rough mountainous land thru heavy timber and medium dense undergrowth. Desc. abrupt rocky NE. slope.
16.70	Rocky ravine, 420 ft. below sec. cor., drains S.30°E., asc. abrupt, rocky SW. slope.
29.30	Rocky spur, 330 ft. above ravine, projects S. Continue along rugged S. slope over numerous large outcrops.
