A mahogany, 5 ins. in dia. bears S 30°00' E, 38
lks. dist., marked: $\frac{1}{4}$ S3BT.

A mahogany, 5 ins. in dia. bears N 48°00' W, 15
lks. dist., marked: $\frac{1}{4}$ S4BT.

Desc. 50 ft. over a N slope to,

43.10 Draw, drains NE, asc. 345 ft. over a broken SE slope to,

82.20 Intersect the Third Standard Parallel North at a point
3.64 chains East of the standard cor. of secs. 33 and
34, heretofore described, and at the point of inter-
section,

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long and 2 ins. in dia. 26 ins.
in the ground to solid rock and in a mound of stone,
for the closing corner of secs. 3 and 4, with a brass

A pinon, 12 ins. in dia. bears S 13°30' W, 96 lks.
dist., marked: T15NR51ES4CCBT.

Land, rugged and rocky slopes of a draw, general E
exposure and drainage.

Soil, partly disintegrated rock on the slopes and a
gravelly loam in the draws.

Timber, pinon and juniper.

Undergrowth, sagebrush, buckbrush and bunch grass.

Good grazing.
