

DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF A PORTION OF THE EAST BDY OF
T. 30 N., R. 59 E.

Chains

From the reestablished cor. of Ts. 29 and 30 N., Rs. 59 and 60 E., hereinbefore described

N.0°22'E., on true line, bet. secs. 31 and 36,

Over nearly level land thru medium dense undergrowth.

- 40.00 The original $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 31 and 36, which is an aspen stake, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., surfaced and scribed on one side, lying on small mound of earth. In center of mound, set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 30 ins. in the ground, for the reestablished $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 31 and 36, with brass cap marked

Dig pits, 18x18x12 ins., N. and S. of post, 3 ft. dist. Thence

N.0°32'E., with continuous measurement, bet. secs. 31 and 36.

- 80.29 The original corner of secs. 25, 30, 31 and 36, which is an old mound of earth with fragments of a surfaced juniper stake, on the largest of which scribe marks are discernible, lying on top of mound. In center of mound, set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 30 ins. in the ground, for the reestablished cor. of secs. 25, 30, 31 and 36, with brass cap marked

Dig pits, 18x18x12 ins., in each sec., 3 ft. dist. Land, level.

Soil, a yellowish white alkaline clay loam, with a heavy gumbo subsoil, 3rd and 4th rate.

Undergrowth, greasewood, rabbit brush, shadscale.

Very little grazing; some rye grass.
