

Dependent Resurvey of the W. Bdy. of T. 33 N., R. 20 E.

Chains. to crest of low ridge.
 59.00 Enter medium to dense growth of juniper, bears E. and W.
 77.60 Top of ridge, bears N. 80° W. and S. 80° E. Gradual descent of NE. slope through dense juniper.
 83.61 Intersect the closing corner of Ts. 33 and 34 N., R. 20 E., which is a volcanic stone, 20 x 20 x 16 ins., above ground, firmly set, and with a large mound of stone W. of the corner and witnessed by bearing trees as described in the field notes of T. 33 N., R. 20 E.

Land: mountainous.

Soil: a heavy clay, very rocky, and thickly strewn with surface rock.

Undergrowth: sage. Fair growth of grass.

Timber: scattering generally in south one-half mile and medium to dense growth in north one-half mile.

Retracements.

From the original corner of Ts. 32 and 33 N., Rs. 18 and 19 E., hereinafter described,

N. $0^{\circ} 02'$ W. on retracement, setting temporary points at 40.00 and 80.00 chs. and making diligent search for old corners. None were found until a point,

162.06. Fall 170 lks. W. of the original cor. of secs. 29, 24, 25 and 30, hereinafter described.

The course of this line is N. $0^{\circ} 34'$ E. and the proportionate length of each mile is 81.03 chs.
