 General Description.

The portion of T. 28 N., R. 22 E. surveyed lies on the extreme southwest corner of the Santa Mate Desert. The land is slightly rolling with a general north drainage. The soil is a sandy, gravelly, and rocky clay of medium texture, containing a strong alkaline content. The vegetation consists of white sage, shadscale, and a very scant growth of grass. This land is suited to the winter grazing of sheep and has no other apparent value. There were no settlers residing within the area at the time of survey and no mineral indications were observed.
