

Dependent Resurvey, Portion of the South Boundary, T. 18 N., R. 65 E.

Chains	N. 89° 47' E., beginning new measurement. Across rolling land in bottom of Berry Creek Canyon. 1.90 Pipeline, underground, course NW. from SE. 3.30 Fence, bears N. 5° W. and S. 5° E.; asc. 300 ft. over steep W. slope. 17.00 Spur, projects N. 20° W. 19.50 Head of wash, course N. 20° W. 24.00 Spur, projects N. 20° W. 33.00 Head of gulch, course N. 35.80 Spur, projects N.; desc. 30 ft. to sec. cor. 38.44 The original cor. of secs. 4, 5, 32 and 33, which is marked by a juniper post, 1½ ins. square, 24 ins. long, decayed in places, but with the following marks remaining legible--TXVIINRLXVE on one face, NRL and XXXII on a second face, XXXIII on a third face and TXVIISIV on fourth face. At the corner point Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 27 ins. in the ground with the original post deposited at base, with brass cap mkd. T18N R65E S32 S33 S5 S4 1943 from which A juniper, 4 ins. diam., bears N. 43 3/4° E., 265 lks. dist., mkd. T18N R65E S33 BT. A juniper, 5 ins. diam., bears S. 62° E., 347 lks. dist., mkd. T17N R65E S4 BT. A juniper, 3 ins. diam., bears S. 25½° W., 145 lks. dist., mkd. S5 BT. A juniper, 6 ins. diam., bears N. 20° W., 226 lks. dist., mkd. T18N R65E S32 BT. Land, mountainous. Soil, rocky. Timber, juniper and pinon; undergrowth, sagebrush, servicebrush and mountain mahogany. Grazing, fairly good.
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Reestablishment of the Survey Executed By E. B. Monroe and A. G. Bateman, Deputy Surveyors, in 1872. Beginning at the original cor. of secs. 5, 6, 31 and 32, on the N. bdy. of the township, which is marked by an old wooden post, 4 ins. square, 2 ft. above an old mound of earth, with indistinct markings.
