

COMPLETION OF SUBDIVISIONS T. 4 N., R. 66 E.

Chains	S. 0° 03' W., on true line, bet. secs. 5 and 6. Asc. 40 ft. over rolling land, along an E. slope, thru scattering timber and undergrowth.
26.00	Wash, 20 lks. wide, course N. 80° E.; over broken, rolling land.
33.44	Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 30 ins. in the ground, for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., with brass cap mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S6 S5 1937 from which A juniper, 8 ins. diam., bears N. 17° E., 18 lks. dist., mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S5 BT. FINAL TEST OF SOLAR ATTACHMENTS

As the survey of this township was commenced and concluded at the same time as was the survey of T. 4 N., R. 65 E., surveyed under this group, see final test of solar attachments appearing in the field notes of that township.

General Description

Fractional township 4 North, Range 66 East, is situated about 20 miles north of Pioche, Nevada. U. S. Highway No. 93 passes thru sections 33, 28, 21, 16, 9 and 4.

The land is evenly rolling, with few precipitious slopes; with the general drainage east and southeastward.

The soil is a rocky clay, 3rd rate, shallow, upon a lava rock and decomposed granite subsoil; a thin layer of wind blown alkaline dust covers the top soil.

A scattering growth of merchantable pine, juniper and cedar timber covers the township. With the 2nd growth timber is found an undergrowth consisting of sagebrush, greasewood, serviceberry and some briar.

The only water within the township is Frying Pan Spring in section 6.

This fractional township is unsuited for either agriculture or grazing.

There are no settlers.
