Chains

Establishment of the SE. cor. of T. 5 N., R. 66 E.

Note: In order to establish a basis for the independent resurvey of the subdivisional lines, T. 5 N., R. 66 E., this SE. cor. of the township is established on the N. bdy. of T. 4 N., R. 67 E. as originally surveyed by Monroe and Bateman, Deputy Surveyors, in 1872, and at a point due S. of the SW. cor. of T. 5 N., R. 67 E. as established by T. K. Stewart, Deputy Surveyor, in 1902.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 30 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., with brass cap mkd.

The original cor. of T. 4 N., Rs. 66 and 67 E., hereinafter described, bears S. 89° 48' W., 6.65 chs. dist.

The original ¼ sec. cor. of sec. 5, a granite stone, set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the official record of T. 4 N., R. 67 E., surveyed by Monroe and Bateman in 1872, bears N. 89° 48' E., 112.83 chs. dist.

The SW. cor. of T. 5 N., R. 67 E., established by T. K. Stewart in 1902, hereinafter described, bears N. 10.81 chs. dist.

A juniper, 10 ins. diam., bears N. 72° 30' W., 2.67 lks. dist., mkd. T5N R66E S36 BT.

A juniper, 6 ins. diam., bears N. 37° 45' W., 1.14 lks. dist., mkd. T5N R66E S36 BT.

A wash, 20 lks. wide, 1 ft. deep, drains WNW, bears N. 7.50 chs. dist.

Dependent Resurvey of the W. Bdy., T. 5 N., R. 67 E.
with establishment of cors. at regular intervals for T. 5 N., R. 66 E.

Beginning at the SW. cor. of T. 5 N., R. 67 E., which is monumented with a granite stone, set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the official record of the Stewart survey, T. 5 N., R. 67 E., in 1902.

A cedar, 12 ins. diam., bears N. 69° 15' E., 40 lks. dist., mkd. T5N R67E S36 BT.

A cedar, 8 ins. diam., bears S. 56° E., 79 lks. dist., mkd. T4N R67E S6 BT.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 30 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
