GENERAL DESCRIPTION All of the land and soil within the portion of T. 4 N., R. 67 E. included in this resurvey is similar. The soil varies from sandy loam to gravelly and about 2/3 of the land is covered with juniper and pinion, varying in density from scattered to heavy. The greater majority of the land lies on a gentle SW. slope and becomes rolling in the north and east part, in the portion near the foothills of the Wilson Creek Range of Mountains. The general drainage is in a southwesterly direction, and empties into Patterson Wash, which runs through T. 4 N., R. 66 E. in a southerly direction. There is no perennial water supply, and the only apparent interest in the land is for the purpose of stock grazing and acquisition of cedar posts. Water is available for the stock in the adjoining area. The only patented land within the township is the NE¼ NE¼ of sec. 25, not included within this resurvey. An old stage road, no longer maintained, runs through the middle of the township from the south boundary of sec. 34 to the north boundary of sec. 3, about 50 lks. east of the cor. of secs. 3 and 4. There are several other dim roads, no longer commonly used, that are in evidence throughout the township.
