Chains	Land, gradual E. slope at base of mountainous land. Soil, alkaline clay loam, sand, gravel and rock, 3d and 4th rate. Undergrowth, sagebrush and desert growth. No timber.

	Reestablishment of the Survey Executed by Hatch, Barker and Eaton, Deputy Surveyors, in 1877, to the Von Schmidt state line, and extension of the survey to the present California-Nevada state boundary. From the cor. of Ts. 3 and 4 S., Rs. 35 and 36 E. S. $89^{\circ} 42'$ W., bet. secs. 1 and 36. ($E\frac{1}{2}$ mile.) Over level land, covered with sand and clay hummocks, 1 to 3 ft. high, thru heavy undergrowth. 36.10 Nevada State Highway No. 3A, bears S. $39\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E. to Dyer and N. $39\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W. to U.S. Highway No. 6. A newly paved road. 40.20 The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 1 and 36, which is monumented with a granite rock, 10 x 8 x 6 ins., above ground, mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ on N. side. At the corner point. Set an iron post, 30 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 20 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd. S 36 $\frac{1}{4}$ — S 1 1953 Bury the mkd. stone along N. side and raise a flat mound of stone, 3 ft. base, around post to top. S. $89^{\circ} 42'$ W., bet. secs. 1 and 36. ($W\frac{1}{2}$ mile), beg. new measurement. 1.40 Old dirt road, out of use, bears N. 10° W. and S. 10° E. 9.78 The closing cor. of Ts. 3 and 4 S., R. 35 E., on the Von Schmidt state line, described in the field notes of the portion of the Von Schmidt state line resurveyed under this assignment. West, bet. secs. 1 and 36, with new measurement, on original survey. 30.39 Point for the cor. of secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36, which is south of the closing cor. of secs. 35 and 36, T. 3 S., R. 35 E., on the Von Schmidt state line. Set an iron post, 30 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 20 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd. T3S R35E S 35 36 S 2 S 1 T4S 1953 Raise a flat mound of stone, 3 ft. base, around post to top. Land, level, except for sand and clay loam hummocks, 1 to 3 ft. high.
