

Extension Survey, Portion of the North Boundary, T. 14 N., R. 57 E.

Chains

Raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, 1½ ft. high, W. of cor.

From this corner, the SW. cor. of T. 15 N., R. 57 E., bears South, 5.90 chs. dist., which is monumented with an iron post, 3 ins. diam., firmly set in ground, extending 12 ins. above the surface, mkd. as described in the official record. All evidence of the pits have disappeared.

I now alter the markings on the brass cap of this cor., which now functions only as the SW. cor. of T. 15 N., R. 57 E., so that it is now marked

Raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, 1½ ft. high, NE. of cor.

Land, rolling desert valley.
Soil, light sandy clay loam, adobe, alkaline, gravelly and rocky.
Timber, none; undergrowth, sagebrush, greasewood, shadscale, rabbit brush and a fair growth of grass.

Dependent Resurvey, West Boundary, T. 14 N., R. 58 E.

Reestablishment of the Survey Executed by
E. B. Monroe, Deputy Surveyor, in 1874.

Note: As all the corners along this boundary northward from the common corner of secs. 19, 24, 25 and 30, are defective in position with reference to surveys in R. 57 E., they are herein reestablished to refer to sections of R. 58 E. only. Additional ¼ sec. and sec. cors. are established at regular intervals of 40.00 and 80.00 chs. northward from the SE. cor. of sec. 13, which refer to secs. in R. 57 E. only.

Beginning at the reestablished cor. of Ts. 13 and 14 N., Rs. 57 and 58 E., described in the field notes of the dependent resurvey of the S. bdy. of T. 15 N., R. 58 E., executed concurrently under the same survey group.

N. 0° 17' E., bet. secs. 31 and 36.

Over rough mountainous land, through dense timber and undergrowth; desc. 750 ft. over rocky broken N. and NW. slopes.

31.70 Ravine, course N. 65° W.; asc. 125 ft. over SSW. slope.

36.60 Spur, projects N. 70° W.; desc. 80 ft. over NNE. slope.

40.00 Point for the ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 31 and 36, at record distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 24 ins. in the ground to bedrock, with brass cap mkd.
