CHAINS	Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd. T27N R61E ½ S 31 S 6 T26N 1965 raise a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, 2 ft. high, N. of cor. Asc. 20 ft. over an E. slope. 47.70 Low spur, slopes SE.; continue along rolling S. slope. 65.40 Wash, 10 lks. wide, 2 ft. deep, drains SE.; continue over gentle rolling land. 80.56 The cor. of Tps. 26 and 27 N., Rs. 60 and 61, monumented with an iron post, described in the resurvey notes of T. 26 N., R. 60 E., executed concurrently under this same group. Land, rolling. Soil, sandy clay and medium gravel. Timber, scattered juniper. Undergrowth, sagebrush. Dependent Resurvey of the Subdivisional Lines T. 26 N., R. 61 E. Mount Diablo Meridian, Nevada Reestablishment of the Survey Executed by Monroe and McClellan, Deputy Surveyors, in 1882 From the standard cor. of secs. 35 and 36, on the S. bdy. of the Tp. N. 0° 05' W., bet. secs. 35 and 36. Over nearly level land, through medium undergrowth. 40.38 Point for the ½ sec. cor. of secs. 35 and 36, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.
