N. 89° 52' W., bet. secs. 6 and 31 Over nearly level land, through scattered undergrowth. 14.30 Wash, 10 lks. wide, 1 ft. deep, drains NE. 30.30 Trail road, bears N. and S. 40.09 Point for the ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 6 and 31, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.
