

DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF THE WEST BOUNDARY, T. 5 N., R. 49 E.

CHAINS

deposit broken glass alongside the iron post and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, 2 ft. high, W. of cor.

76.21 Intersect the First Standard Parallel North.

Point for the closing cor. of Tps. 5 N., Rs. 48 and 49 E., at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

The standard ¼ sec. cor. of sec. 36, T. 6 N., R. 48 E., bears N. 89° 19' W., 27.30 chs. dist.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The area resurveyed along the south and west boundaries of Township 5 North, Range 49 East, is gently rolling and lies in Stone Cabin Valley. The elevation ranges from about 5,800 to 6,000 ft. above sea level. The soil is sandy and the vegetation consists of shadscale, budsage, sagebrush and sparse native grasses.

The area drains southwesterly into the central portion of Stone Cabin Valley. No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey. Access into the area is provided by a graded road bearing north and south through the east portion of Township 5 North, Range 48 East. The principal use of the land is cattle grazing.
