	Set an aluminum post, 30 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with aluminum cap mkd. T28N R66E R67E S 1 S 6 S 12 S 7 1976 raise a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, 2 ft. high, W. of cor.
	N. 0° 50' E., bet. secs. 1 and 6. Over rolling land, through scattered sagebrush, greasewood and shadscale. 1.50 Wash, 20 lks. wide, 3 ft. deep, drains ENE. 1.80 Trail road, bears ENE. and WSW. 40.49 Point for the ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 1 and 6, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.
	Set an aluminum post, 30 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with aluminum cap mkd. T28N R66E R67E ¼ S 1 S 6 1976 raise a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, 2 ft. high, W. of cor.
80.98	The original corner of Tps. 28 and 29 N., Rs. 66 and 67 E., monumented with the decayed remains of a squared wooden post, loosely set in the center of a circle of stone, with illegible scribe marks visible. From which the remaining original bearing tree: A juniper, 6 ins. diam., bears N. 30° E., 23 lks. dist., with illegible scribe marks visible on open blaze. (Record, N. 37° E., 20 lks. dist.) At the corner point Set an aluminum post, 30 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with aluminum cap mkd.
