

DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF A PORTION OF THE SOUTH BOUNDARY,
T. 20 N., R. 43 E., MDM, NEVADA

CHAINS	
10.80	Trail road, bears N. and S.
11.20	Fence, bears N. and S., enter pasture land.
34.50	Reese River, 30 lks. wide, 1 ft. deep, course N.
40.28	Point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 4 and 33, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner. Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd. T20N R43E S 33 $\frac{1}{4}$ S 4 T19N 1978 set a steel fence post, 5 ft. long, 2 ft. in the ground alongside the iron post.
45.00	Enter rolling land, through scattered sagebrush; asc. 160 ft. over gradual E. slope..
73.10	Fence, bears N. and S.
80.56	The original cor. of secs. 4, 5, 32 and 33, monumented with the decayed remains of a squared wooden post in pieces in the center of a mound of stone. At the corner point Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 12 ins. in the ground to bedrock and in a mound of stone to cap, 4 ft. base, with brass cap mkd. T20N R43E S 32 S 33 S 5 S 4 T19N 1978 reset the remains of the wooden post alongside the iron post.
