Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd. T20N R42E R43E $\frac{1}{4}$ S 1 S 6 1978 set a steel fence post, 5 ft. long, 2 ft. in the ground, alongside the iron post.

From the cor. of secs. 35 and 36, on the S. bdy. of the Tp., monumented with an iron post, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., exposed 10 ins. above the ground and in a collar of stone to cap, 3 ft. base, with brass cap mkd. as described in the field notes of the dependent resurvey of T. 19 N., R. 43 E., executed under Group No. 414. N. 0° 18' E., bet. secs. 35 and 36. Over gently rolling land, through crested wheat grass.
17.40	Enter scattered sagebrush, bears E. and W.
39.96	Point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 35 and 36, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.
