40.01	Point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 1 and 36, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.
	Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
