Reestablishment of the Survey Executed by
D. H. Barker and J. H. Eaton, U. S. Deputy Surveyors,
in 1880, and Resurveyed by
H. Fitzhugh, U. S. Deputy Surveyor,
in 1894.

From the cor. of Tps. 37 and 38 N., Rs. 67 and 68 E.,
monumented with an iron post, 3 ins. diam., firmly set
in a collar of stone, with brass cap mkd. as described
in the field notes of the dependent resurvey of T. 37
N., R. 67 E., executed under Group No. 26.

N. 0° 09' W., bet. secs. 31 and 36.

Over gently rolling land, covered with medium sagebrush,
scattered cacti, shadscale, bitterbrush, juniper and
native grass.

34.90 Fence, parallels highway.

36.60 State Highway No. 233, bears N. 70½° E. and S. 70½° W.

40.52 Point for the ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 31 and 36, at
proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence
of the original corner.

Set an aluminum post, 30 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 24
ins. in the ground, with aluminum cap mkd.

Set a steel fence post, 5½ ft. long, alongside the
aluminum post.

41.20 Fence, parallels railroad tracks.

43.20 Telephone line, parallels railroad tracks.

43.80 Southern Pacific Railroad tracks, bears N. 61¼° E. and
S. 61¼° W.

48.90 Fence, parallels railroad tracks.

55.40 Trail road, parallels railroad tracks.

81.04 The cor. of secs. 25, 30, 31 and 36, monumented with a
limestone, 20x16x12 ins., firmly set 10 ins. in the
ground, mkd. with 1 notch on the S. edge and 5 notches
on the N. edge.
