Note: The westerly control for the closing cor. is the original 1865 terminal cor. on Rector's survey of this Tp. bdy., bears S. 89°56'30" W., 30.749 chs. dist., hereinafter described.

Also from this closing cor., the closing cor. of Tps. 16 and 17 N., R. 18 E., California, bears N. 0°41'10" E., 0.040 chs. dist., hereinafter described.

Reestablishment of the Survey Executed by
Butler Ives, in 1865

From the cor. of secs. 19, 24, 25 and 30, on the E bdy. of the Tp., monumented with a stainless steel post, 2 1/2 ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 18 ins. above the ground, and in a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, to top, with brass cap mkd. as described in the field notes of the 1986 resurvey record, from which the remains of the original bearing trees

A stump hole (with fir bark ring, 40 ins. diam.), bears N. 26 1/2° E., 133 lks. dist., no marks visible.
(1861 Lawson Record, N. 27°30' E., 134 lks.)

A fir snag, with broken top, 10 ft. tall, 31 ins. diam., bears S. 84 1/4° E., 63 lks. dist., with scribe marks T16N R19E BT and a chaining notch visible on open blaze.

A red fir, 31 ins. diam., bears S. 55° W., 66 lks. dist., with healed blazes. (1861 Lawson Record, S. 57°15' W., 63 lks.)

A stump hole (with fir bark ring, 30 ins. diam.), bears N. 48 1/4° W., 41 lks. dist., with decayed snag remains alongside, with scribe marks T16N R18E S2 BT and a chaining notch on remains of blaze. (1861 Lawson Record, N. 45° W., 40 lks.)

A red fir, 11 ins. diam., bears N. 70 3/4° E., 34 lks. dist., with scribe marks T16N R19E S19 BT visible on open blaze.

A red fir, 17 ins. diam., bears S. 32 1/4° E., 39 lks. dist., with scribe marks T16N R19E S30 BT visible on open blaze.
