Chains

40.797 Point for the 1/4 sec. cor. of secs. 13 and 24, at proportionate dist.; there is no evidence of the original cor.

Set a stainless steel post, 28 ins. long, 2 1/2 ins. diam., 20 ins. in the ground with a magnet at base, and in a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, to top, with brass cap mkd.

A granite boulder, 4 x 2 x 5 ft. high, bears S. 35°30' E., 26.5 lks. dist., mkd. BXO on NNW face, 3 1/2 ft. above ground. Boulder lies at N edge of rock and boulder outcropping.

A granite boulder, 12 x 5 x 5 ft. high, bears N. 26° W., 4.8 lks. dist., mkd. BXO on SW face, 2 ft. above ground.

Cor. is located on timbered W slope.

50.10 Ravine, 5 lks. wide, drains S. 50° W.

50.95 Jeep trail, 12 lks. wide, bears N. 40° E. and S. 40° W.

81.594 The cor. of secs. 13, 14, 23 and 24.

From the cor. of secs. 7, 12, 13 and 18, on the E bdy. of the Tp., monumented with a stainless steel post, 2 1/2 ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 20 ins. above ground, and in a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, to top, with brass cap mkd. as described in the field notes of the 1986 resurvey record, from which the original bearing trees

A pine, 34 ins. diam., bears N. 29 1/2° E., 153 lks. dist., with healed blaze. (1861 Record, N. 30° E., 152 lks.)

A stump hole, bears S. 82° E., 75 lks. dist., with fir snag remains alongside, 35 ins. diam., no marks visible. (1861 Record, S. 80° E.)

A pine, 39 ins. diam., bears S. 72° W., 119 lks. dist., with healed blaze. (1861 Record, S. 69° W., 117 lks.)
