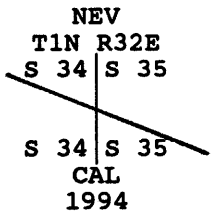
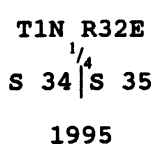
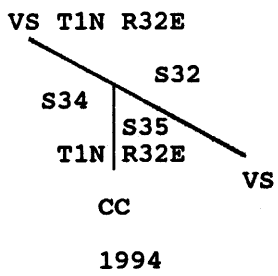


DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF A PORTION OF THE SUBDIVISIONAL LINES,

	Reestablishment of the Survey executed by U.S. Deputy Surveyor, L.D. Bond in 1879 From the standard cor. of secs. 34 and 35, on the Mount Diablo Base Line, hereinbefore described. N. 1°44'50" E., bet. secs. 34 and 35. Gradual descent over a NW. facing slope, through sagebrush and other native grasses. 1.075 Intersect the U.S. Coast and Geodetic Survey California-Nevada Oblique Boundary Line. Set a stainless steel post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, over a DEEP-1 magnetic marker and in a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, to top, with brass cap mkd.  NEV T1N R32E S 34 S 35 S 34 S 35 CAL 1994 39.159 Point for the ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 34 and 35, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original cor. Set a stainless steel post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, over a DEEP-1 magnetic marker, with brass cap mkd.  T1N R32E S 34 ¼ S 35 1995 40.916 Intersect the 1872 Von Schmidt Eastern Boundary of California. Point for the closing cor. of secs. 34 and 35. Set a stainless steel post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 27 ins. in the ground, over a DEEP-1 magnetic marker with brass cap mkd.  VS T1N R32E S34 S35 T1N R32E VS CC 1994
