The closing cor. of Tps. 40 N., Rs. 62 and 63 E., monumented with a redwood post, 3 ins. square, 30 ins. long, with illegible scribe marks visible, loosely set in a mound of earth. This cor. will now refer to the NW. cor. of T. 40 N., R. 63 E.

At the corner point

Set a stainless steel post, 28 ins. long, 2¹/₂ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
