	GENERAL DESCRIPTION The lands dependently resurveyed and subdivided within Township 17 South, Range 51 East, are part of the Ash Meadows National Wildlife Refuge located in the Amargosa Desert, and ranges from about 2,100 to 3,100 ft. above sea level. The terrain is nearly level to low mountainous. The soil is sandy clay loam in the lower elevations to rocky in the higher elevations, and vegetation consists of scattered mesquite and native grass. Access to the area is provided by numerous improved roads, unimproved roads, and trail roads. Principle users of the area are recreationist and hunters. No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey.
