66.00 The road leading up and down Reese River bears N. W. & S.

72.50 Reese River 10 lbs wide 2 feet deep, quick current runs North

80.00 Set a Post for Standard cor to Tps 21 North Ranges 42 & 43. East, deposit a chain stake rain mound of earth with pits as per instructions

General Description

Land, the first 3 1/2 miles mountainous remainder sloping gently Easterly towards Reese River. Scattering Nut Pine, Cedar timber on the mountainous portion of line. No water was found, on the mountainous Range of mountains, about 8 miles North of the line and in the Ravenswood Mining District, the finest and the heaviest timber in the country is located.

Reese River at the place I crossed it possesses no grass or alluvial bottom lands, but fine meadows on the River are visible both above and below
